

"I had a dream that you gave birth to a strong son. We are to name him Kanati, the Lucky Hunter," said Chief Wohali proudly.






"Dear husband, I also had a dream last night that I am going to give birth to a beautiful daughter named Ahyoka, which means, She Brings Happiness."
